## Faith, Hope & Love Wall Hanging



Finished Size Approximately 19" X 12"

Supplies:


1/4 yard (or fat quarter) for center background rectangle1/8 yard for narrow piping (border around the center rectangle)3/8 yard for outer border and binding3/8 yard or fat quarter for backingBatting

Cutting: (WOF = width of the fabric, usually 44-45" wide for cotton quilting fabrics.)

- 1. From the center rectangle fabric cut one piece 14.5" X 7.5"
- 2. From the narrow piping fabric cut two strips the WOF that are 7/8" wide
- 3. From the border fabric cut two strips the WOF that are 3" wide. From these strips cut two that are 12.5" long and two that are 14.5" long.
- 4. From the same border fabric cut two more strips that are the WOF for your binding. I like to cut mine 2" wide, but there is enough fabric allowed to cut them wider if that is your preference.

**<u>Step 1</u>**: Fold the narrow piping border strips in half, wrong sides together and press.



**<u>Step 3</u>**: Aligning the cut edges, sew on the top and the bottom piping. (Scant <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from edge)



**Step 5**: With right sides together, using a <sup>1</sup>/4" seam allowance, sew on your top and bottom borders (14.5" long pieces). Press the seams towards the borders. Next, sew on the two side borders (12.5" long pieces) and press those seams towards the borders.



**Step 2**: Cut two lengths of the piping border that are 7.5" long and two that are 14.5" long. (I made mine a little longer and trimmed off the excess after sewing them on.)



<u>Step 4:</u> Aligning the cut edges, sew on the two side pieces. . (Scant ¼" from edge)



Step 6: Layer the completed top, batting, and backing fabric; quilt as desired. Bind the wall hanging. Attach your punch needle designs by hand sewing them or using fabric glue.
